





This event is a great honor for us and confirms that Poland is becoming an increasingly recognized host of the most important sporting events in Europe.



Visitors can enjoy a blend of tradition and modernity, experience Polish hospitality, and explore a wide variety of cultural and culinary experiences.






POLAND

The city hosts major international events, and its modern Aqua Lublin aquatics center is one of the best swimming facilities in the country



Castle and the Chapel of the Holy Trinity



Centre


for the Meeting of Cultures

Another specialty is the Pieróg biłgorajski, a baked dish of buckwheat, potatoes, and cottage cheese, hearty and unique. Lublin is also known for Forszmak, a thick soup with meat and vegetables, often served in bread. These regional dishes perfectly reflect the city's culture and hospitality.





From Katowice


Car – approx. 350 km (around 4.5h drive via A4 and S19/S17 expressways)




From Lublin Airport to Aqua Lublin


By public transport: Bus line LA (Lublin Airport – City Centre) operates directly from the terminal. The journey to the city takes about 40 minutes. From the city center you can continue by local bus or trolleybus to Aqua Lublin (approx. 10-15 minutes).

By taxi / ride-hailing apps (Bolt, FreeNow): approx. 25–30 minutes. By car: approx. 25 minutes (14 km).

Aqua Lublin is one of the most modern aquatics complexes in Poland and a flagship sports facility of the city. It includes a 50-meter Olympic swimming pool with a movable bottom and modern timing system, an additional 25-meter training pool, and facilities for both recreational and professional use.



The venue is fully equipped to host international swimming competitions and has already been the stage for numerous national and European events.

The complex also offers extensive fitness and wellness areas, including a gym, saunas, and rehabilitation zones, making it a multifunctional center for athletes and the local community.

Its location in the city center, close to hotels and transport connections, ensures excellent accessibility for participants and visitors alike.



Events

Freestyle: 50 m, 100 m, 200 m, 400 m, 800 m;

Breaststroke: 50 m, 100 m, 200 m;

Backstroke: 50 m, 100 m, 200 m;

Butterfly: 50 m, 100 m, 200 m;

Individual Medley: 100 m, 200 m;

Freestyle Relay: 4 x 50 m;

Medley Relay: 4 x 50 m;

Mixed Freestyle Relay: 4 x 50 m (2 women and 2 men);

Mixed Medley Relay: 4 x 50 m (2 women and 2 men).











Competitors shall be eligible for a club either affiliated to a Member Federation or affiliated to a Federation registered by European Aquatics. (according to rule MA-G 2.1)

All competitors must be citizens of a country corresponding to the domicile of at least one EUROPEAN AQUATICS member federation or they must have resided continuously for twelve months in a country corresponding to the domicile of at least one EUROPEAN AQUATICS member federation before start of the competition. Proof of citizenship or residence for the last twelve months is required and must be proofed when asked by the organizer. (according to rule *MA-G 2.3*)

Entries, including signed Release of Liability by every competitor, shall be sent to the Organising Committee together with one photo (passport size) and with full front view of face (passport standard form). (according to rule MA-G 2.4)

The Organising Committee shall check name, age, proof of citizenship / residence and entries before handing out the accreditation card (according to rule MA-G 3.3 and MA-G 2.3)



Organizer has the right to limit the entries if there will be too many entries taking into account the facilities. In case of too many entries, the number of events per person will be limited first on daily basis and secondly by individual events. There shall be no restrictions for the entries to relays.

No qualifying time is required, but instead everyone is required to have swum the event in the last two years and register with a time in it. It is up to the Organizing Committee to follow this up.

If a swimmer clearly fails to achieve the time she / he has registered by over 10% without obvious reason, he / she may be excluded from all upcomming individual events.

Competitors participating in 400 m and 800 m races shall confirm their participation to the Organising Committee no later than six p.m. (18.00 hrs) on the day prior to the event (according to rule MA-SV 2.1).


Clubs participating in Relay Events shall confirm their participation and submit the names of the competitors and the order of swimming no later than six p.m. (18.00 hrs) on the day prior to the event. Reserve swimmers are not allowed in Relay Events. (according to rule MA-SW 2.2).




